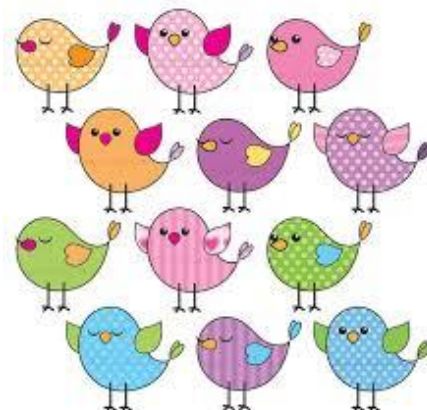
Meet Mr. Shane Nelson

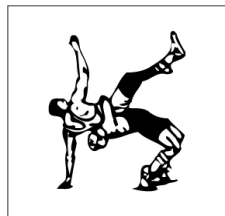
