

STUDENT CONDUCT

Behavior that is not conducive to the learning or team environment, including, but not limited to, unnecessary tardies, class disruption, uncooperative or distractive attitude, failure to be prepared for class, practice, or events, failing to observe the dress code, profane or vulgar language or conduct, or other behavior that requires students, teachers, or coaches to divert their attention from the learning or team activity would be considered a disruptive influence. Students who are a disruptive influence shall face disciplinary actions that may include Suspension from school.

Assault: Students involved in assault / fighting may be referred to the Safe Schools Policy when it is deemed appropriate. Assault / Fighting will result in Suspension from school for all people involved. On the second incident, a long Suspension can result, and further incidents could result in expulsion. Assault / Fighting is prohibited in the school building, on the campus, or at school functions, whether in or out of town. The campus includes the surrounding areas as far as an incident might be seen from any part of the school building. A fight that originates on the school campus, but is completed elsewhere can be considered in the same light as the one that originated and is completed on the school grounds.

Bullying: Bullying will not be tolerated, It will be defined as any physical act, verbal comment, gesture, facial expression or action that would intentionally hurt someone which would including leaving someone out.

Computer Use: All students are required to comply with Policy #4177 regarding students' use of school computers. (Refer to Page 34 and 35.)

Dress Code: Refer to Page 22.

Disorderly Conduct: Conduct likely to lead to a disturbance of the public peace or that offends public decency. It has been held to include the use of obscene language in public, fighting in a public place, blocking public ways, and making threats. Statutes against disorderly conduct must identify the specific acts that constitute it. Student should show a respect for authority: The school staff, which includes administrators, teachers, secretaries, custodians, and cooks are responsible for carrying out the school program as directed by the Board of Education. Students are expected to respond, without argument, to any reasonable request made by any staff member or police officer. (This includes giving the correct name and surrendering student body card.) Failure to obey such requests is insubordination and will result in disciplinary action.

Drinking, Drugs and Use of Tobacco: The Box Elder School District Board of Education recognizes that the use, possession, distribution, or sale of tobacco, alcohol, narcotics, and all other controlled or dangerous drugs and drug paraphernalia within 500 feet of a school building constitutes a safe school violation and is also viewed as a hazard to students and considered illegal according to Utah State Law. (Refer to Pages 27 and 28.) The use, position or sale of alcohol, narcotics or other controlled substances will be referred to the safe schools policy.

Disruption of School: Class interruptions are annoying to students and teachers. A class can only be interrupted with the permission of a counselor or an administrator.

Sexual Harassment: The Box Elder School District forbids sexual harassment as an illegal form of discrimination.

Hall Passes: Students should have a hall pass with them whenever they are out of class

Hazing: "Hazing" refers to any activity expected of someone joining a group (or to maintain full status in a group) that humiliates, degrades or risks emotional and/or physical harm, regardless of the person's willingness to participate. In years past, hazing practices were typically considered harmless pranks or comical antics associated with young men in college fraternities.

Language: Profane language is annoying to the majority of students and staff at BRHS and is not appropriate. State and city ordinances make profanity illegal and could also be considered as sexual harassment. A student can be suspended for use of profane language. Profane language to a staff member will result in Suspension and a parent conference.

Public Display of Affection: Anything beyond holding hands is not appropriate at school or school activities.

Safe Schools Policy: (District Policy #5005, Safe Schools: Student Violence/Criminal Behavior Policy) Box Elder School District is committed to fostering an environment in the public schools for students, staff, community, neighbors, and visitors which is safe,

conducive to the learning process, and free from unnecessary disruption. A safe school environment includes the school and grounds during school hours, district-provided transportation and school-sponsored activities. Policy #5005 has been created for this purpose in accordance with Utah State Law (UCA 53A-11-904, 905, 906, 907). (Refer to Pages 27 and 28 for an outline of this policy. Any individual who wishes to read the entire policy may obtain a copy from this BRHS or the District Office.)

Theft: Students who are guilty of theft or in the possession of stolen goods will be handled severely. Cases will be handled either through school action or referral to the police department depending on student cooperation and how severe the case.

Consequences for inappropriate school conduct will be depended on the seriousness of the inappropriate action or behavior and the number of incidences the student has been involved in. the following matrix will ensure that the consequences for inappropriate school behaviors will remain fair and consistent from one incidence to another.
