

Credit Recovery Program

Purpose

Bear River High School works with Dale Young Community High to offer a remediation program in order to provide an opportunity for students to recover credit for core-required courses in an alternate setting. The Credit Recover program is located in the library of Bear River High but managed through Dale Young Community High.

Policy

- Students who fail a course in Language Arts 9, 10, 11, 12, Geography, World Civilization, US History, Fit for Life, Health, Secondary Math 1 and 2, Earth Systems, Biology, General Financial Literacy, Computer Technology, Art Foundations, Drawing, or Chemistry can register for a remediation session.
- Classes in remediation will carry the same course number as the original failed class.
- Students will work through module packets facilitated by a teacher certified or endorsed in the content area.
- Students must pass established testing criteria at 80% to receive credit for the course. Anything less will result in a failing grade.
- Special accommodations will be given to those students who have an active IEP according to written goals.
- Students are allowed to repeat the remediation class upon failure one time only. Fees paid for the first attempt may not be applied to the second enrollment, but must be paid again before the student is able to attend the class.
- The sequential nature of math courses will require a student to remediate the failed level before being allowed to enroll in the next level.
- Students are encouraged to enroll for only one subject in a given trimester.

Procedure

- Counselors will identify failing, or potentially failing students at week ten (10) of each trimester.
- Students and parents will be notified by letter, phone call, or email if they are failing a course.
- They will be given information regarding the course necessary to remediate and how and when to sign up for the session.
- Fees are due no later than the first (1st) day of class the session is held.
- Sessions last two (2) hours from 3:00 – 5:00 P.M. after school Monday through Thursday.
- Roll will be taken at each session.
- Summer sessions begin the week after school lets out in June.

Financial Information

- Student fees are \$60 per course for one-half (1/2) graduation credit.
- Fees are due the first day of the class. Students may not attend until fees are paid.

- **See summer session exception.
- No partial or extended time for fee payment will be allowed.
- **NO REFUNDS.**

Summer

- Summer sessions will begin the first Monday after the third trimester ends and run for two consecutive weeks, two hours per day.
- One or two sessions a day, or a second two-week session may be scheduled, depending on enrollment.
- Students can enroll for more than one subject in the summer if the sessions do not conflict.
- Ten (10) students must be enrolled to run a session.
- Sessions may be combined.
- Enrollment and fees are due the last week of the third trimester.
- Late enrollments will be accepted on the first day of the session only, and fees must be paid that day. (This applies to summer sessions only.)
