

STUDENT / FACULTY PARKING

1. **Students** are allowed to park in the following areas:

- South of the Vocational Education Building
- West of the Vocational Education Building
- North of the Natatorium
- South of the Natatorium (Driving Range – student parking during school hours **ONLY**)
- South of the Driving Range

It is illegal to park vehicles outside the designated parking stalls, which are outlined in yellow. Any parking violation will be fined the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

2. **Faculty parking** is located in the following areas:

- West of the Counseling Center and south to the Auditorium
- South of the Visitor Bleachers
- East of the Vocational Building
- Immediately west, along the back of the Vocational Building
- North of the Band Room/Cafeteria

It is illegal to park vehicles in these areas unless a Bear River High School Parking Permit is visibly displayed inside the vehicle. Any parking violation will be fined the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

3. It is illegal to park a vehicle in a designated **handicap** stall. Any vehicle without a handicap sticker parked in these handicap stalls on campus will be fined one hundred dollars (\$100.00).
4. Any vehicle parked in the **bus lanes** will be fined seventy-five dollars (\$75.00).
5. The fine for jay walking violations is \$70.00.
6. The Garland Police will issue tickets for violations. Fines will be paid to the Garland City Court.

The following parking safety rules will be adhered to:

1. In an effort to assure that Bear River High School maintains a safe learning environment, all cars parked on campus are subject to reasonable search and seizure. Bear River High School administration and local law enforcement agencies may use dogs and/or other resources to search (including random searches) the campus, parking lots, and cars thereon, to assure student safety.
2. During times of student parking lot use, **there will be no loitering, just standing around by individuals or in groups, or sitting in cars.** Students will park their cars and then go on campus where they need to be.
3. If, for any reason, a student needs to go to his/her car between classes or during class, he/she needs to have a check out slip, a note from their teacher or administrator to do so, or a pass from any school program that requires use of their car. A student in the parking lot without a note could result in a truancy being given.
4. Reckless driving, speeding, or endangering pedestrians will result in police referral.
5. The speed limit in all parking lots is 10 mph.
